Overcrowding/Funding Issues

- Traditional Schools (3) being looked at to be changed over to standard catchment in order to receive more funding from government - children in those schools concerned about this (Choice program - more like private school)
- Modulars being used in place of portables, not creating a lot of extra seats
- Large push to change funding for portables from operating budget to capital funding. DPAC raising focus on chronic underfunding on capital projects and that impacts the students

Bussing

- Many families are without bus service in district due to financial constraints
- Bussing costs have increased by 41% due to inflation
- District looking at routes to work with families

- By-election could be coming soon

- Parents always needed to help with advocacy work on behalf of students

- Sheri will be leaving our school next year, a new yearbook co-ordinator will be needed, please think of anyone who can take over this role

New Business

- Originally had purchased 2, but they were sent back. We have purchased one at \$440, but need to vote to purchase a second one.
- Spend vote for second art drying rack up to \$500 11 voted yes

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony

 Is there anything PAC can do to assist the school with? Karen thinks that around March (after spring break) this will happen, perhaps tie it together with community event - food trucks, carnival games, face painting

Tae Kwon Do for school sport?

- PAC can look into doing Tae Kwon Do instead of Lacrosse as the fitness contribution for next year
- Lacrosse was already agreed upon by the teachers for the coming new year, a lot of planning goes into this as far as scheduling (starts in May of following year)

Tech Upgrade

 Gaga ball pit will not cost as much as originally quoted, all extra money will go to purchasing more MacBooks to complete the set purchased with jog-a-thon funds

Playgrounds

- Blue playground (Kindergarten) is scheduled to be removed in June. Playground committee will need to be formed. Karen looking into what school would like put in there, perhaps an outdoor learning area
